RE: Vaccination Update

Thank you for your continued support to protect children in Wigan through vaccination. As schools settle into the autumn term, we would like to take this opportunity to highlight the importance of ensuring that children are up to date with their routine vaccinations.

Vaccinating school-aged children not only provides vital protection for them, but also reduces the number of school absences, minimises disruptions to learning and wider impacts on educational settings.

This update provides information on routine vaccination programmes relevant to your school, useful resources to support you and your school community as well as details about things you can do to continue to protect our children and young people.

Winter Vaccination Programme (Flu/Covid)

Vaccination continues to be the best protection against flu and COVID-19. Intrahealth will continue to deliver the seasonal influenza immunisation programme across Greater Manchester in winter this year. The national ambition is to achieve a 100% offer to pupils across reception to Year 6, with a national requirement that all schools are visited by 13th December 2024. Intrahealth has already contacted schools via an initial letter that was recently circulated. In this letter, Intrahealth has asked schools to identify a vaccination lead for Intrahealth to liaise with. This will enable Intrahealth to agree with you the best approach for gaining the consent of your pupils and to develop operational plans for your school.

Both Flu vaccination and COVID-19 vaccinations are also recommended for staff who are at higher risk of getting seriously ill from these diseases, including those aged 65 or over, pregnant staff, or immunosuppressed individuals. [Flu vaccination](#) for the majority of eligible groups will be available on the NHS from 3rd October 2024, and can be obtained from GP surgeries or pharmacies that offer NHS flu vaccination. The COVID-19 vaccine is also offered on the NHS and can be booked online, or through a GP surgery. It is recommended for those who are eligible for the COVID-19 and flu vaccine to top up their protection, even if they received doses last year, as viruses change, and protection fades over time. The NHS will contact those who are recorded as eligible for flu and COVID-19 vaccines, however, please also remind staff to take up the offer if they are eligible.

Measles

There continues to be a heightened risk of measles in the UK, with [2,387 laboratory-confirmed cases](#) in England since 1st January 2024. Measles is highly infectious – 9 out of 10 unvaccinated children can catch measles if someone in their class has it. Measles infection can result in serious complications and long-term disability, particularly in those who are immunosuppressed, infants and pregnant women. Two doses of MMR vaccine remain the best way to protect children from measles, mumps and rubella infection. Further information can be found on the [NHS website](#).

Wigan Council has been working with local partners to raise awareness of measles and its symptoms, how to prevent transmission, and increase the take up of the measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine.

The [latest published data](#) on MMR uptake shows that this work is having a positive impact on levels of coverage in the Borough. In the last year, we have seen increases in the level of coverage in our children aged 5 and under, with those receiving one dose at 24 months increasing from 92.8% to 93.5% and those having received two doses at 5 years increasing from 88.9% to 89.1%. However, we continue to focus our efforts on further increasing coverage in our communities particularly with children, young people and adults who may be less likely to take up the offer of vaccination and would be grateful for your continued support in doing so.

What you can do to help

We ask you to ensure that your school community continues to be made aware of the importance and benefits of vaccination, including through:

- Circulating the enclosed letter to all parents, which also includes information on [how to obtain MMR vaccination in Wigan](#).
- Ensuring that vaccinations are promoted on school premises and in general communications to the school community. Resources to do so can be found below.
- Advise parents and carers to check their child's Personal Child Health Record (PCHR), known as the red book, or contact their GP practice if they are unsure of their child's vaccination status or have missed vaccinations.
- Identify a vaccination lead for your school/setting to liaise with vaccination providers, and to raise awareness of vaccination opportunities within the school community.
- Raise awareness of vaccination opportunities with staff, particularly those that are pregnant or immunocompromised.
- Review business contingency plans for your setting in the event of significant cases of communicable diseases in your setting.


